"Cambodia continues to pursue an independent rule-based foreign policy that upholds

its core interests, guarantees sovereignty and peace, and boosts economic ties,"

Emphasized Deputy Prime Minister Prak Sokhonn

Phnom Penh, 01 February 2023- His Excellency PRAK Sokhonn, Deputy Prime Minister, Minister of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation of the

Kingdom of Cambodia, briefed on 01 February 2023 the Commission on Foreign

Affairs, International Cooperation, Information and Media of the National Assembly of

the Kingdom of Cambodia on "Cambodia's Foreign Policy in the New Context of World

Order" at the National Assembly.

"Over the last five years, the world continues to evolve to an international

system with a global, multipolar and complicated nature. This evolution has led to

profound, rapid, uncertain and precarious transformations," Deputy Prime Minister

Prak Sokhonn opened his presentation.

On international and regional contexts, he highlighted, among others, the

rivalry of superpowers with a myriad of security, economic and development alliance

and initiatives across the regions, impact of the Covid-19 pandemic, Ukraine war,

crisis in Myanmar, and tensions in the Korean Peninsula.

On domestic front, Cambodia's successful control of the Covid-19 pandemic,

great accomplishments of its ASEAN chairmanship in 2022, active and sincere

endeavours in the capacity of ASEAN Chair and Special Envoy to address Myanmar's

deep-rooted and complex crisis, and international recognition of Cambodia's

independent rule-based foreign policy were also featured.
